
#### Trafford Labour will:

- Provide more Special School places, to keep more Trafford children close to home.
- Support families to get the right support at the right time. Giving families a holistic package of help from a variety of professional teams including speech and language specialists, parenting professionals, and social workers.
- Continue to prioritise our young people with Special Needs through the Trafford Inclusion Charter.
- Support parents of SEND children with our services for them (SENDIASS and the Trafford Parent Forum).

- Provide enough childcare places for everyone who is entitled to the free hours of childcare enabling more parents to return to work.
- Work with healthcare providers to make sure young people who need support can access mental health services.
- Work tirelessly with partners to protect our young people from exploitation.
- Continue to provide targeted youth services (in parks and at the Talkshop) to engage young people in positive activities.
- Invest in education by expanding secondary schools where there is a need.
- Offer parents a place in Reception at one of their chosen primary schools.
- Encourage all our cared-for children and foster families to succeed through; social groups, skills workshops, the Cared For Children's Council and groups that support foster carers.

### Tackling The Climate Crisis



Trafford Labour are committed to making Trafford a greener, cleaner, borough.

Trafford was the first local authority in Greater Manchester to declare a climate emergency and work is underway to achieve Trafford Council's ambition to be carbon neutral by 2038.

We need to improve air quality. Residents and visitors need environmentally friendly ways to get about the borough. We also must support businesses to reduce their carbon emissions.

#### Trafford Labour will:

- Work to secure funding to install more onstreet cycle storage.
- Remain one of the top Boroughs for recycling in Greater Manchester.
- Progress work to deliver a heat network, providing low carbon energy servicing thousands of planned properties in North Trafford.
- Continue to fund City of Trees, to help deliver the ambitious plan to plant one million trees across Greater Manchester.
- Decarbonise public buildings by installing heat pumps and solar panels to power our estate.

- Collaborate with Greater Manchester Combined Authority to enhance biodiversity across our conurbation.
